

## CAFS Report for October 2011

The second film in the season on Fri 14 Oct at 7.30 in Caldbeck Village Hall is a classic Hitchcock thriller : **Strangers on a train**. Made in the USA in 1951, it lasts for 101 min and is in black and white. The screenplay involved Raymond Chandler and was adapted from a Patricia Highsmith novel.

Guy (Farley Grainger) and Bruno (Robert Walker), meet by chance on a train and in the course of making conversation, they both realise that each has a problem. Guy has an unfaithful wife, Bruno has a spiteful father. Charming playboy Bruno proposes that he could murder Guy's wife in exchange for Guy murdering Bruno's father and both their problems would then be solved. Bruno is one of Hitchcock's most charming villains

Guy is shocked by the idea but later when Bruno actually carries out his side of the plan and expects Guy to do likewise, he is appalled and from there on, the suspense increases to a terrifying finale.
